




## **Don't Miss** TRASH TALK!

## WIPES CLOG PIPES



Clogged plumbing can be difficult and expensive. Stop the clog before it starts! Never flush wipes even if labeled "flushable". They do not break down in water and cause sewer backups. ONLY FLUSH THE 3Ps – pee, poop, and toilet paper.

# Sewer Rate Increase

The 7.5% increase (\$26 per year for single-family residential customers) is part of a five-year plan approved by the Board on June 1, 2021.

The 2023 sewer service charge for single-family residential customers became \$368 per year (from \$342 per year) on July 1, 2023. The new rate remains the lowest in Alameda County.
