ALL customers must subscribe to organics (green waste) and recycling services.



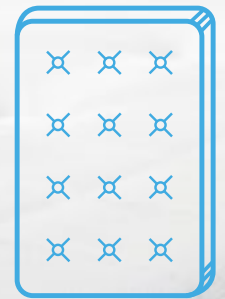
All organics and green waste must be kept out of the trash (landfill).

Mattress Disposal is Easier than Ever and Free!



Waste Management (WM)* is offering a free mattress drop-off program at the Davis Street Resource Recovery Complex for all Alameda County residents - no appointment needed. The program allows for free disposal of up to a combined total of 5 mattresses and/or box springs per day (self-haul). The disposed mattresses are disassembled and recycled.

The program is funded through a \$10.50 recycling fee that is collected when a mattress or box spring is purchased in California. The fee is used to establish free drop-off locations (such as this) and events, and to combat illegal dumping and mattress recycling processing research.

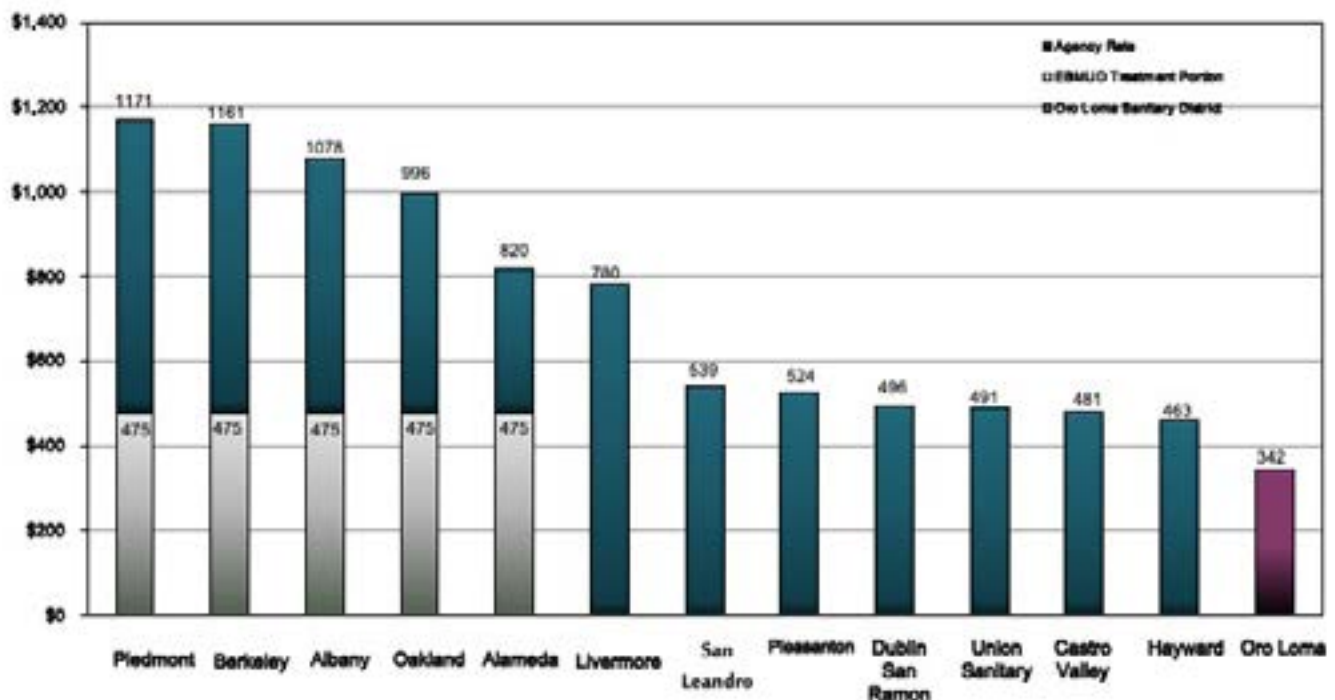

Christmas Tree Recycling



Waste Management will collect
Christmas trees curbside
January 2 -13, 2023.

- Natural trees only, 6 ft and under, or trees cut into lengths smaller than 6 ft.
- NO flocking, tinsel, ornaments, tree stands, or nails. (Cut up flocked trees and place in the trash.)
- Place natural trees next to your green organics cart on your regular collection day.
- Bulky waste pickup is suspended during the Christmas tree pickup period.
- After January 13, 2023, natural trees may be cut up and placed in the green organics cart for pickup.

Holiday Wrap - Recycle or Trash?

Not all holiday wrapping is recyclable. ***Please reuse or trash bows and ribbons, metallic, foil, or glitter paper.***

Place regular paper wrap in the blue recycling cart.

Pour oil from deep frying into a sealable container and bring it to one of Alameda County's household hazardous waste sites.

WIPES CLOG PIPES.

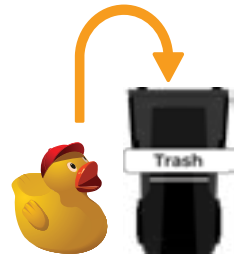
Wet wipes, baby wipes, and flushable wipes ALL go in the TRASH.
